The Binder Fitting and Loan Program

Project Description

The project aimed to establish a peer staffed Binder Fitting and Loan Program through the Gender Wellbeing Service at SHINESA in partnership with BFriend at Uniting Communities. The program was intended to provide a safe, informative, peer-led space for financially disadvantaged trans men, transmasculine, and assigned female at birth non-binary individuals to obtain and trial binders for no cost.

Outcomes of Project

The binders for this project were purchased with help from a local South Australian store called Folx Emporium and delivered to the Gender Wellbeing team. At this point in time, due to the impacts of COVID-19, this program is yet to be made available to the community, however, we will continue to progress these original plans once safe to do so.

Who was involved in the project?

Our Gender Wellbeing Service Peer Coordinator, two Gender Wellbeing Service Peer Volunteers, and a BFriend worker lead the development of this program.

The project was initiated on the September 4, 2019 and was finalised on the 30th June 2020.
